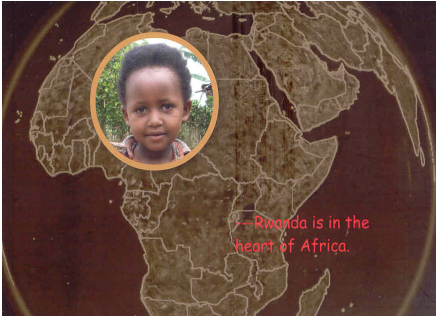




THE RWANDA SCHOOL PROJECT

GREETINGS FROM RWAMAGANA, ESPECIALLY FROM OUR STUDENTS!!!

The Rwandan public school system includes six elementary grades and those classes are taught in Kinyarwanda while the university teaches its classes in English. Our school, consisting of six grades, S1, S2, ..., S6, teaches our students English, mathematics, history, and science. In November 2015, 16 students formed our first graduating class. We participate in nationwide testing and our students have consistently tested at the top of private intermediate schools in Rwanda.

The Rwanda School Project's mission is to provide high quality secondary education in Rwanda. We opened the Rwamagana Lutheran School in 2010 to offer a secure and nurturing school environment that transforms vulnerable youth into future leaders and problem solvers who champion environmental sustainability and social change.

After the horrendous 1994 genocide in which 1,000,000 men, women, and children were killed in 40 days, the country has come together to build the safest and fastest-growing African country. The path from their past to their future is the education of their children. The Rwanda School Project has built an intermediate school to bridge the gap from the public education system to the university, with special emphasis on educating girls and older students.
